









Black History Month

We are celebrating the achievements and contributions of black people across the world. We are exploring black history, heritage, tradition and culture through stories, games and activities. We are giving the children the opportunity to think about diversity in their community and encourage them to question representations and their own aspirations for the future.









News from Reception

Black History Month

The children have been exploring traditions and cultures of Black people both in the UK and around the world. We have been focusing on the story 'Coming to England' by Floella Benjamin and 'I love my hair.' We were visited by Lorraine who spoke about her Jamaican heritage and how she cares for her black hair. She spoke about how she braids her own hair using the synthetic hair extensions. Children then had the opportunity to try braiding using pipe cleaners.







Enjoying opportunities to be physical in Reception

Children have been using their gross motor resources to develop their coordination, strength and perseverance. Activities that support the children's physical development provide the opportunity for new challenges and build their self-esteem. Mr Ross has provided climbing, balancing and jumping obstacle courses for their indoor PE sessions. We have been introducing the children to new ball games using our Reception outdoor area, including hockey and basket ball.











We enjoy using the adventure playground and the gym trail on the back green to support our motor skills.

Year One Outdoor Learning Area

In Year One we have enjoyed exploring our fantastic outdoor area. The children use it to support their learning. We have a maths zone, a construction zone, a creative area, an English writing shed, a water zone, a role play zone, a small world area and digging areas for the children to explore.

Once a week the children have the opportunity to use the area to practise reading through games and activities. On a Wednesday afternoon they get a session to learn through play supporting our topics. They also get the opportunity to take their learning outside when the weather is nice and it is great to see them learning and having fun!











Autumn Artwork

Autumn is a beautiful time of year and lends itself to some lovely artwork.

The children have been creating autumn leaf characters after reading the story 'Leafman'.

In English, the children created a story for their character using the time conjunctions first, next, then and finally.



Religious Education

This term in RE the children have been learning about Christianity with a focus on belonging. We have made lots of links to our school values. The children have been learning about belonging to the church and christenings. This week the children acted out a christening ceremony taking on all the different roles.





Phonics & Reading Workshop

We loved having the parents and carers in to Year 2 this half term to share our new phonics scheme and reading books in school. The children had a great time working with their parents on a variety of phonics and reading activities.









A Mystery at Fairfield...

The children in Year 2 have been putting on their detective hats to help solve a mystery that occurred in the playground. They had to look for the evidence and clues for what had happened so that they could write a crime report and a recount of events. We interviewed a witness, Mr Teare, who saw what had happened.





Super Scientists!

The children have loved our Science learning on living and non-living things as well as habitats. The children have been investigating habitats and microhabitats in our school area and have been using their scientific skills to record data. They had a go at creating their own habitats in groups and they look fantastic! They had to make sure their habitat had everything that the animal or minibeast needed to survive.

A great start!

The children have settled in brilliantly at Colneis. They have made a great start and are making a lot of effort to not only improve their English and Mathematics but to also experience a wider curriculum. We hope you enjoy seeing some of their work this term.

Outdoor Learning

This year, the school has introduced 'Outdoor Learning' to the wider curriculum. The children have been participating in lessons to investigate the outdoor surroundings. The sessions have also been cross curricular with Science. The children have been learning about trees around the grounds and identifying types of trees by their characteristics. In Science, the children have been studying different types of soil samples, identifying what is found in soils and how to make a wormery.











Art and Design

There was great excitement when we introduced the Year 3 children to their Colneis Art Sketch-books! Lessons have included mark making, observation skills and pencil techniques. The children have sketched beach huts and took part in a whole school project called 'The Dot'. We have also designed our Christmas Cards independently looking at Christmas themed pictures.










The Dot

At the beginning of September Year 4 used 'The Dot' by Peter H. Reynolds as a basis for some Art and English work. The children created their own dot from their imagination and then decided where their dot had come from and made up a short story about their 'dot'. They had some very interesting ideas!!







Outdoor Learning

The children have been lucky enough to have had 2 sessions with Mrs Churchyard outside—focussing on our outdoor environment.

The first session was spent actually listening and looking at what is around us and the second session focussed in on all the different trees we have in our location and using the bark, leaves and branches to identify the trees.

We are now looking forward to our next sessions after half term.

Greek Myths

In English we have been looking at some Greek Myths and considering who the intended audience would have been and what the main parts are that each myth shares. There is always a problem and a resolution and usually a mythical creature of some kind.

The children acted out Theseus and The Minotaur and then retold it in their own words.



Outdoor Learning

A new addition to our curriculum this year is Outdoor Learning, which is led by Mrs Churchyard. In our sessions this half term, the children have been introduced to the school's wildlife area and have spent time observing the natural world around them. They successfully used a grid reference on a map to locate various places within the school grounds. In addition, they spent time identifying a range of the trees on the school field, by considering their trunks, leaves, fruit and seeds. The children all enjoyed the outdoor environment, the fresh air and the relative freedom to roam.



Science: Forces

Through their learning about Forces, the children have been developing their scientific skills of asking questions, making predictions, setting up tests, observing and measuring, recording data and interpreting results. Within this, they have conducted experiments to learn about gravity; have used force meters to understand the difference between mass and weight and have considered the impact of friction by pulling a shoe along on a variety of different surfaces.







History: Fitzwilliam Museum, Cambridge



Ancient Egypt was brought to life during our trip to the Fitzwilliam Museum in Cambridge. Our guides successfully took us back in time, as we explored the considerable range of artefacts on display, and the children were able to embed their classroom learning by visualising how the ancient Egyptians actually lived.





Year 6 have had a busy and exciting start to the new school year. Our topic for this half term has been 'Rivers' and next half term we will be learning about 'Coasts'. The children are enjoying their swimming lessons at the Felixstowe Leisure Centre and have taken part in a number of sporting events this half term such as football and cross country.



PGL Bawdsey Manor

Year 6 started the year with a residential stay at Bawdsey Manor where they challenged themselves and worked as a team.









Arts Mark

As part of the whole school Arts Mark project, Year 6 read the story 'The Dot'. The children completed artwork and wrote and performed poems about how important it is to celebrate who were are.







House Captains

The school have been busy electing Year 6 House Captains and Vice Captains. All candidates made a speech to their house. Congratulations to this term's winners.





Year 6 made flowers and wrote memories for a display to remember the Queen.
