Maths: As mathematicians we will learn ...

- o 1:1 counting to 10
- Recognise numbers that are significant (e.g. house number and age).
- o Comparing measure (e.g. taller/heavier).
- Subitise numbers to 6 (e.g. dots on a dice).

Songs:

5 little monkeys swinging in a tree

Understanding the World: As explorers, we will learn ...

- Look closely at similarities, differences and patterns.
- Notice change in own environment and that of others.
- o Demonstrate scientific method.
- Solve simple problems and make simple inferences.

Communication and Language: As communicators we will learn ...

- Listen to the opinion of others when in a small group.
- Understand simple 'who', 'what' and 'where' questions.
- Use past, present and future tenses appropriately in speech.
- o Retell simple stories.
- Understand 'how' and 'why' questions.
- Ask questions about events that have happened or are about to happen in the future.
