News from Nursery



The Elves and the Shoemaker

We have enjoyed sharing this traditional tale and highlighting the gift of giving. Tap and Stitch visited our Nursery and were pleased to send notes to children who they 'caught being kind'. The story inspired a shoe shop role play area and we made a simple graph to discover which shoe fastening was the most popular.









Repeating pattern elf hats

Children's ability to see patterns forms the basis of early mathematical thinking. We created our paper plate elf hats using a simple repeating pattern. The children were confident and able to repeat a sequence pattern of two colours: red and green.









Dream Snow: Honey on Toast

In Nursery, we love to share the book Dream Snow, by Eric Carle. After a busy day on the farm, the Farmer likes nothing more than to sit in his favourite chair drinking hot peppermint tea and eating honey on bread. We gave the children the opportunity to develop their independent skills, using a knife to spread butter on a slice of toast and to give honey a try if they hadn't had it before. The children did a marvellous job and enjoyed this little treat.




Letters to Santa

We used the story 'The Dot' as inspiration for artwork, both indoors and outdoors. Children

imprints in clay, including



dots by exploring colour mixing. We will continue this collaborative art project in the new year.



We're Going on a Bear Hunt

This term we read the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. We watched the author Michael Rosen telling the story using actions and we all joined in. This really helped us with our retelling of the story. Following on from this, we made story maps with a range of resources to retell the story in order.

Later, we went on our own Bear Hunt around the adventure playground. We found a wooden wobbly bridge, a hard, bumpy path, wet, soggy leaves and green, prickly bushes. The children used their adventure to write new sections for the story.



Science and DT

This term in Science we have been exploring a range of materials and their properties, in particular wood, metal, plastic and fabric.

The children have sorted objects made from these materials and thought about the properties and why they are used for certain objects.

We were very excited to receive a letter from Santa and the Elves, asking for help to design a new toy. The

children made their designs thinking about the

material they would use and the following week they made a prototype out of junk modelling to send to Santa.







Step Poems

This term we have had a focus on adjectives. The children have been introduced to using a Thesaurus to find more interesting words.

We chose an animal to create a step poem and used our exciting adjectives. We then performed our poems in front of the class.

We were incredibly proud of our dancers for their performance. They worked so hard to learn their routine and they performed it beautifully.




Historians in the making...

Our children have loved learning about The Great Fire of London and being able to develop their History skills. They have asked questions, used a range of sources to carry out research, have answered their questions and created non-fiction fact books about what they have learned. Their non-fiction fact books look incredible! We have enjoyed using this topic within our Art and Reading lessons too to create some beautiful artwork and to explore diary entries.

















In Computing lessons the children have been learning how to use Purple Mash. They have really enjoyed using it in our provision during our Great Fire of London topic as there are lots of quizzes, games and activities for them to use. We have been impressed with how much they can do independently! Well done Year Two.










A great start!

The children have continued to settle brilliantly at Colneis. It has been great meeting those who attended the parents evening, in person or online, to discuss your child's progress. So far we are pleased with the attitude and manners across the year group and look forward to planning school trips in the Spring term. We are also very proud of the children's recent performance at the Carol concert.

Topic

This term the children have enjoyed travelling back over 10,000 years to the times of the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. Using secondary sources of information, the children have learnt about these periods of times and have been making comparisons about aspects of their lives: homes, clothing, food, tools, weapons, battles and significant historical figures such as Boudicca.







Physical Education

Year 3 have enjoyed taking part in PE and swimming lessons this term. It is brilliant that they have an opportunity to experience various sports at Colneis. In gymnastics, Year 3 have been learning to incorporate balance and movements to create a sequence. The children have put together a routine in small groups and performed this to the Greatest Showman music.





Outdoor Learning

The children have had the opportunity to plant seeds to grow in our new raised beds and have been carrying out a bean experiment to observe the process called germination. The children have also been learning to take photographs of our natural surroundings.











Art and Design

The children have been learning about Kurt Schwitters, an artist who was famous for his work using the technique of collage. They have learnt to layer a variety of materials, to use different textures, to use complimentary colours and to design their own images.





Special visit - 3C were very lucky to have a special visitor show their extensive fossil collection. We are lucky to be able to have visitors to share their knowledge and experience with the children.







Science Visitor

Just before the half term break, all of Year 4 were fortunate to spend a session with a visitor from 'Hands on Science'. This was a practical session where the children developed their understanding about how we hear and why bats ears are able to hear so well. The children enjoyed making a whistle to take home with them!





Music

We have enjoyed developing our learning on the Glockenspiels. We have developed our understanding of rhythm and keeping in time and understanding the different symbols for a 'rest' and the timing that is associated with it.



Greek Week

During Greek Week the children participated in a number of activities. We made headbands, bracelets and face masks in the style of the Ancient Greeks. We learnt about the early Greek Language and tried to write our name in Greek!

The week ended with a reenactment of the Greek Olympics and a Greek Play Performance where the whole year group performed to one another.





History: Ancient Egypt

During our trip to the Fitzwilliam Museum, the children had the opportunity to see a 3,000 year old mummified body. In school, the children then explored the mummification process and carried out their own mummification on a doll. As part of this, the children used a cocktail stick to remove the brains, removed the other organs and placed them in canopic jars, washed



the body in water, salt and spices, and finally wrapped the body in loo roll before laying it to rest in a sarcophagus.









Science: Forces and Air Resistance

Bringing science to life, the children made parachutes in two different sizes to test whether a larger parachute would fall to the ground more slowly than a small one due to the effect of air resistance. The children were supplied with plastic bags, string and washers and then used their scientific knowledge to design a fair test. Having made suitable predictions, the year group gathered in the hall and conducted six tests in order to prove if air resistance was greater with a larger parachute.









Art: Alberto Giacometti



Focusing on the work of Swiss sculptor, Alberto Giacometti, the children have been making their own figurative sculptures. This involved: bending wire to form the basis of the body; using Modroc to wrap around the body and, finally, painting the figure in metallic coloured paint.









Year 6 have had a very busy term learning. They have worked incredibly hard in all subjects and the teachers are impressed with all their efforts.

Dance

This half term, 6RW and 6S have been working on a James Bond themed dance and performed to the other Year 6 classes.





6J have worked hard to learn their showcase dance. They performed brilliantly at Felixstowe School in front of an audience.



Design and Technology

In DT, Year 6 have been designing and constructing their own Jack in the Box. They have accurately measured the card and wood and are now beginning to saw and hot glue the frame.





Science

In Science this term, we have been learning about Micro-organisms. We set up a bread experiment to investigate where mould grows the best.





Christmas Carols

Year 6 visited St Andrews Church where they shared Christmas readings and performed a variety of songs. It was a lovely experience for the children.
