

## **News from Nursery**

#### **Dough Disco**

We have introduced the children to a new weekly pen pals activity.....Dough Disco!!

Dough disco involves moulding playdough in time to music and performing different actions in time to music such as rolling it into a ball, flattening it and squeezing it. This activity helps to strengthen children's fine motor muscles to enable them to develop their pencil grip.







#### **Lunar New Year**

The children enjoyed exploring lots of activities to increase their knowledge of this special festival. The week culminated in a very exciting lion dance. The children dressed up in brightly coloured clothing and used drums, cow bells and cymbals to drive away bad luck.









#### Come rain or shine

It's lovely to see the children enjoying the new nursery garden and exploring their friendships. It's a joy to watch them play and explore together and being outside allows them to develop friendships with children that they may not usually seek out. They are demonstrating excellent social skills; sharing, taking turns, co-operating, listening and managing friendship difficulties. ## **News from Reception**

#### **Chinese New Year**

The children have been exploring traditions to celebrate Chinese New Year. They learnt that children would help to clean and decorate their homes, wear special clothes and eat special foods. We explored other traditions through crafting including making lucky dragon puppets, red money envelopes and lanterns. We also learnt about the Great Race which determined the cycle of animals used for each new year, this year being the Year of the Rabbit.

Children used puppets and an ice experiment to explore ordinal numbers, calculating the 1st to 12th winning positions. Children enjoyed dragon dances and performed the Happy New Year song (Gung Hay Fay Choy) on Fun Friday. The celebrations were concluded with a lantern parade and fireworks artwork.







#### **Health Week**

In January we enjoyed a variety of activities to help us think about taking care of our bodies and minds. We played 'keepy uppy' with balloons on Fun Friday as well as making healthy fruit kebabs. Children enjoyed mindfulness activities including yoga and mindfulness colouring. We were also visited by a dentist who helped us to think about foods that are kind or harmful to our teeth. We also practised good teeth brushing techniques under the guidance of the dentist, Dr Hamilton.







#### Topic this half term—Antarctica

#### Geography

This half term the children have enjoyed learning about the continent of Antarctica. We looked at maps and a globe and identified the 7 continents.

We have learnt it is an island and that it is the driest, windiest and coldest place on the planet. We learnt about the animals on and around Antarctica. We learnt there are 7 different types of penguins, with Emperor penguins being the largest. The children were amazed to find out that an Orca (Killer whale) is actually part of the dolphin family and not the whale family!



#### Geography / Art

We set the children a challenge to create their own map of Antarctica. They used a map to identify key features and landmarks and made these with art materials and added them to their own maps.

## **Special Visitor**



#### **Australia topic**

This half term the children have loved learning all about Australia and Aboriginal tribes. The children spent time investigating key words and phases linked to our new topic using their Vocabulary Victor skills. They listened to a range of Dreamtime stories which they then had a go at rewriting. They loved sharing their learning with the other classes as they all learned about a different Dreamtime story. They've had art, geography, reading and PSHE lessons all linked to our topics. We have been learning about animals that live in Australia and writing a non-fiction fact piece. We will be celebrating the end of our topic through Australian art lessons.















We loved having parents in for our Maths workshop on Monday. They had a chance to explore our new Maths resource, Times Table Rockstars, and parents had the opportunity to come to class and see how we solve calculations with their children. Thank you to all of the adults who attended, it was lovely to see so many faces there!





The children have been working hard to improve their Literacy and Numeracy skills this term. They have continued their Invaders and Settlers topic, learning about how the Romans changed Britain, which they all seem to be enjoying. We are looking forward to our Roman day on Monday 6th March. Please may we ask that you continue to help your children at home with reading, revision of times table facts and practise of spellings. Thank you for your support and we hope you enjoy seeing some of the work the children have been doing in Year 3.


**English** Maths

In English, we have

been learning to use a thesaurus to expand our vocabulary. We have written wanted posters of Boudicca and a persuasive poster to sell a Roman Villa.



In maths, we have been putting the children's times table knowledge to the test over recent weeks. The children have been learning to multiply and divide numbers using formal methods.





#### Science

This term, Year 3 have been learning about healthy lifestyle choices and how bones and muscles work. The children have been investigating whether there is a correlation between the length of their femur and how far they can jump.









We have been learning how to mix paints to create different tones and shades of colour. The children have recreated the Van Gogh Starry Night painting. They have also been making fruit salad as part of their science, DT and PSHE work.











#### **Outdoor Learning**

In our outdoor learning sessions with Mrs Churchyard this term we have been noticing the changes in our trees over the winter months. We have used a key to identify the trees. We have also explored our outside space by creating food chains, beginning with a plant (producer) and ending with the predator.



#### Music

This term the focus has been 'Mama Mia' by ABBA. We have enjoyed learning the song, considering the rhythm and tone. We have used glockenspiels and recorders to create an accompaniment to the song.



In RE this half term, we have been learning about the Hindu religion—particularly the story of Rama and Sita. We have been considering the importance of this story to the Hindu belief. In class we made puppets of the characters and then re-enacted the story in the form of a puppet show.







#### **Visual Impairment Peer Awareness Training**

The children participated in visual impairment peer awareness training in January, with the aim of providing them with an opportunity to experience how those people who are severely sight impaired manage their daily lives. The session was split into three parts, which included mobility work, group and partnered blindfold exercises and braille activities. This learning experience was both thoroughly enjoyable and valuable, particularly in terms of increasing awareness.











#### **History: The Tudors**

Welcome to the Tudors. The children began this term's history topic by acting out the Battle of Bosworth, where King Richard III was defeated; the War of the Roses came to an end and the reign of the Tudor family began. As part of their learning, the children had to investigate who killed the Princes in the Tower—a mystery which remains unsolved in the present day. To follow was an initial research lesson on King Henry VIII, where the children became experts in one particular aspect of his life and had to share their findings with the rest of the class.









#### **Science: Dissolving Experiment**

Take six everyday items (salt, sugar, flour, rice, sand and jelly) and investigate which ones will dissolve in water—that was the task set for the Y5 children as part of their learning about 'Properties of Materials'. The children made predictions, designed a fair test and recorded their results.










# Year 6 are continuing to work hard and are enjoying their learning, especially our World War II Topic

#### **World War II Day**

The children began their day with a long walk to the train station. One of the children explained, 'The train ride was loud and took ages to get to the countryside! When we arrived, the kind ladies of the village provided us with a drink and biscuit before we were then chosen by our billets.'









The school day included arithmetic, handwriting, dictation and reciting a poem. When an adult entered the room, the children were expected to show respect by standing until told to sit.
