News from Nursery

Dinosaurs

The children have become Palaeontologists as we continue to explore our Dinosaur theme.

They have made their own fossils using clay and are enjoying identifying fossils in our Fossil

Hunter role play area.

World Bee Day 2023

It was World Bee Day on Saturday 20th May 2023 and we have been busy raising awareness and learning all about these rather special insects. The children have looked at the parts of a bee and learnt exciting new vocabulary. They were particularly fascinated to discover that a bee sees colours very differently to us and that there is even a special colour called 'Bee Purple' that only bees can see! This inspired us to create our own flower artwork. We used natural materials to create our own pinecone bees and coloured our own posters.









News from Reception

Reception are great scientists!


This term, we have been focusing on a range of scientific explorations. Children have been exploring materials with some great weaving on the back green. We have started our planting project using vegetable seeds and mermaid themed hanging baskets. We have had the wonderful first-hand experience of observing chicks hatching from eggs. The Living Egg Company provided the perfect equipment for observing the growing chicks. The project has generated great opportunities for writing and research using information books and life cycle diagrams.











People Who Help Us - Fire Brigade

Reception had the privilege of visiting the Fire Station to learn about the role of a fire fighter in the community. The children learnt about the specialist equipment and clothing that help the fire fighters to rescue and protect people and animals. They discussed staying safe near fire and how to call for help using 999. Children were then able to explore the fire engine and to use the hose to aim water at the rescue tower.












Topics this half term: The Hungry Caterpillar story, Minibeasts and Victorians

Victorians

The children have been learning about schools in Victorian times.

We learnt that the teachers were very strict and punished children with a cane if they did not listen. Children had to wear a dunce hat if they made a mistake. We have compared school now to school in the early 1900's and the decision was unanimous; all children are glad to be in school now because they feel supported and it is more fun. The children got to experience a Victorian school on Victorian Day!







Visiting the school pond

We had an exciting visit to the school pond. The children were very excited to find tadpoles, water fleas and a newt in the pond.

We took turns to have a close look at what we had discovered and talked about how the creatures move through the water. The children asked lots of questions and are excited to go again soon!



Art—Sketching

The children have worked very hard on their sketching skills to draw a section of our school building. They took time to look at the outline shape and then attempted to draw this with a light pencil stroke. They then looked closely to add details. The following week the children used water colours to add colour to their sketch.

The children in Year 2 have loved learning about the Coronation of King Charles III and his wife Camilla. They asked King Charles (Mr Rimmer) lots of questions in our special assembly and enjoyed making and wearing their crowns in school. They made Coronation biscuits and completed a range of activities to learn about this historical event!












Science - plant investigations

The children are super scientists and have been really interested in learning about the lifecycle of a plant and what they need to survive. The children have planted their own seeds and are loving watching them grow and completing their plant diaries each week. We are also carrying out an experiment to see whether plants with no light, no water and no space are able to grow. We will see what happens!











PE superstars

Year Two have really enjoyed their PE lessons and have loved doing a range of activities. They've been doing dance, cricket, games, cheerleading and some children took part in dodgeball and cricket tournaments.








This term we have been busy with our Rainforest topic. We have learnt where they are in the world and why they have an important part to play in our everyday lives. We have used a cross curricular approach to this topic so we can continue to build the children's knowledge about the natural world.

In English and topic lessons, we've been learning to write information texts, researching information using safe and reliable sources. The children have written excellent pieces about the layers of the rainforest and rainforest animals.

In Art, the children have used their sketching and collage skills to create leaves and flowers to build our displays! In Science, we are learning about the structure of a plant and the role they play in the pollination process.

Finally, we had a fantastic trip to Colchester Zoo this week. The children were exploring the zoo, looking at the animals and finding facts about them. They learnt about why animals are endangered and participated in workshops about the layers of the rainforest. It was a brilliant day and we look forward to doing it all again next year! I would also like to say a massive thank you to our volunteers and for people who offered to help. We really appreciate your support and we are sorry we couldn't take more of you along with us.


























Outdoor Learning

In our outdoor learning this half term we have been learning to use a key to identify creatures found in the Wildlife Area. We have also been able to watch our planted wheat grow. The recent wet weather has kept them well watered!













Landguard Nature Reserve

Before the Easter Holiday we visited
Landguard Nature Reserve. We
learnt about how long it takes different items to decompose in the water
and why it is so important to take
our rubbish home to help protect the
wildlife and sea creatures. We spent
some time looking for creatures on
the beach and litter collecting.

Food and Farm Fair

At the beginning of the Summer Term we were fortunate to be chosen to attend the Food and Farm Fair. The rain held off and we were able to learn about where our food comes from and meet some animals. Some of us were even lucky enough to meet Royalty!













Maths: Angles

The children have been learning how to draw and measure angles using a protractor, whilst understanding the difference between acute, obtuse, reflex and right angles. They then progressed to learning some key angle theorems including how to calculate the missing angles around a point on a straight line and around a point in a full turn.









The Coronation of King Charles III

As Britain enters a new era with the coronation of King Charles III, the children were taught about the role of the British monarch in representing Britain and its values. By investigating key themes from the reign of Queen Elizabeth II, the children explored the values represented by Queen Elizabeth during her reign and considered how she communicated those values through her actions. The children drew comparisons to our school values. They then produced a proclamation speech for King Charles, some of which were then presented in assembly.







Outdoor Learning: Seed Planting

With a link to this term's science topic of 'Living Things and Their Habitats', our first outdoor learning session involved the children sowing a range of seeds. They worked in groups to read and interpret planting instructions for six different flowering plants. They then individually planted a nasturtium seed. The children have been monitoring the progress of development over the course of this half term.


Cross Country—29.3.23
