These partnerships also include our fantastic parent body who we look to engage with regularly, both formally and informally, in order to continue to move our schools forward.




THE THRIVE APPROACH

As a school, it is our role to provide inspiration and academic challenge for all children. However, what is also of equal importance is providing every child with support for their emotional wellbeing, working alongside parents to develop a strong sense of emotional literacy.

We therefore implement the Thrive approach across both schools. Not only do we train our staff in understanding emotional health and the science behind how anxiety and frustrations impact on our brains, but we also provide support to our children in finding strategies to help them in difficult times. The Thrive approach provides a way for the children to explore their feelings and begin to put into practice some of the strategies that may be able to help them in the longer term.

We aim to help children become well-rounded and well-educated young people. By working alongside families, we are able to support the whole child to help them thrive both academically, emotionally and socially.

OUR VALUES

We take our role in helping children to become positive citizens of the future very seriously. In order to achieve this, we focus on eight key values that form the culture and ethos within our schools.

The children are taught how to behave positively, and be kind to both themselves, as well as others. By modelling these values within the school environment, we believe that every child is given the resources to be a confident and responsible adult.

SCHOOL TRANSITION

We have established a successful process to guide children through the school transition process, from joining Fairfield Infant, moving to Colneis Junior for Year 3 and finally moving on to high school.

It is our belief that the continuity of a student's educational experience can be enhanced significantly by the quality of the personal and professional links established at each stage of transfer.

Prior to starting school, we invite both parent and child to meet members of the school community and become familiar with the school environment. Once the child's school journey begins, we regularly offer parents the opportunity to come into school to share time with their child. Events include Stay and Play sessions, class assemblies and open afternoons.

Once children move to their final year at Fairfield, they are designated a 'buddy' student from Colneis. This ensures that when the time comes for them to move to Year 3, they have already had the opportunity to form a friendship with an older child. Additionally, they will have numerous opportunities to visit Colneis throughout their time at Fairfield via sports days, swimming lessons, cross curriculum activities and transition day visits.

As the children prepare to move on to high school, we provide our senior school colleagues all the information they require to ensure that they are aware of the strengths and needs of the students prior to transfer to high school. We liaise with high schools to arrange high school visit days and for high school staff to visit Colneis to answer any questions the children may have.

Our large team of experienced staff bring all their expertise to support this area.



SUPPORT FOR LEARNING

Our pastoral care, and the support for each individual student, is central to our ethos. From classroom assistant to class teacher, from year group leader to senior leadership team, our priority is meeting the needs of our students and ensuring that every child can develop and excel. We offer tailored intervention where required and have designated members of staff who are able to support both child and family where necessary.

Our curriculum is broad and balanced, focused on ensuring that all students make the best progress they can. It provides highly positive experiences and rich opportunities for high quality learning.

We support, challenge, encourage, inspire, nurture, focus, model and provide a structure so that every student is known, and their particular needs met.

Ambitious plans are in place to continue extending this area. We believe that happy and contented children will learn more effectively and it is our duty to support children and families in this area.



SCHOOL FACILITIES

Over both schools we continually strive to ensure that our facilities offer the best learning environment and opportunities for the children.

At Fairfield over recent years we have created two outside classroom areas that have provided an excellent learning environment for our Reception and Year 1 pupils. The Nursery has also benefitted from extensive redevelopment in the last 2 years.

Having successfully completed the development of the school MUGA at Colneis, we are delighted to be investing financially into technology at the school.

Each year group in KS2 have daily access to Chromebooks. In addition, we have redeveloped our existing ICT space to create two more teacher rooms to support small group work.

Furthermore, we continue to focus on vocabulary development and reading for all children. We have contributed substantial funding at both schools to restock and develop our libraries.

At Fairfield, this funding has ensured that the reading scheme books match our phonics scheme, adding value to this area. At Colneis, investment has been made in the Accelerated Reader programme which continues to provide a vital resource.

We also value our outdoor learning spaces and these continue to be enhanced at both schools.



WRAP AROUND CARE

We offer the following wrap around provision, both before and after school.

BREAKFAST CLUB

During term time, we offer a self-funded, non-profit making Breakfast Club held in the school hall at Fairfield. Commencing at 8am, the children are served a nutritious breakfast followed by a range of age-appropriate play activities. For children based at Colneis, staff escort them on a 'walking bus' to ensure they are at Colneis in time for the start of the school day. The Fairfield children join their classmates in time for registration.

The cost to attend Breakfast Club is £3.75 per day.

WRAP AROUND AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

During term time, Premier Education run an after-school club in the school hall at Fairfield. Children based at Fairfield are escorted through to the hall after school. For children based at Colneis, Premier staff escort the children on a 'walking bus' to Fairfield. The children enjoy a variety of activities, including sport and craft. There are two options available to parents:

- Early session: 3.15pm-4.45pm. Cost £7.00 per session
- Late session: 3.15pm-6pm (light meal included). Cost £12.50 per session
